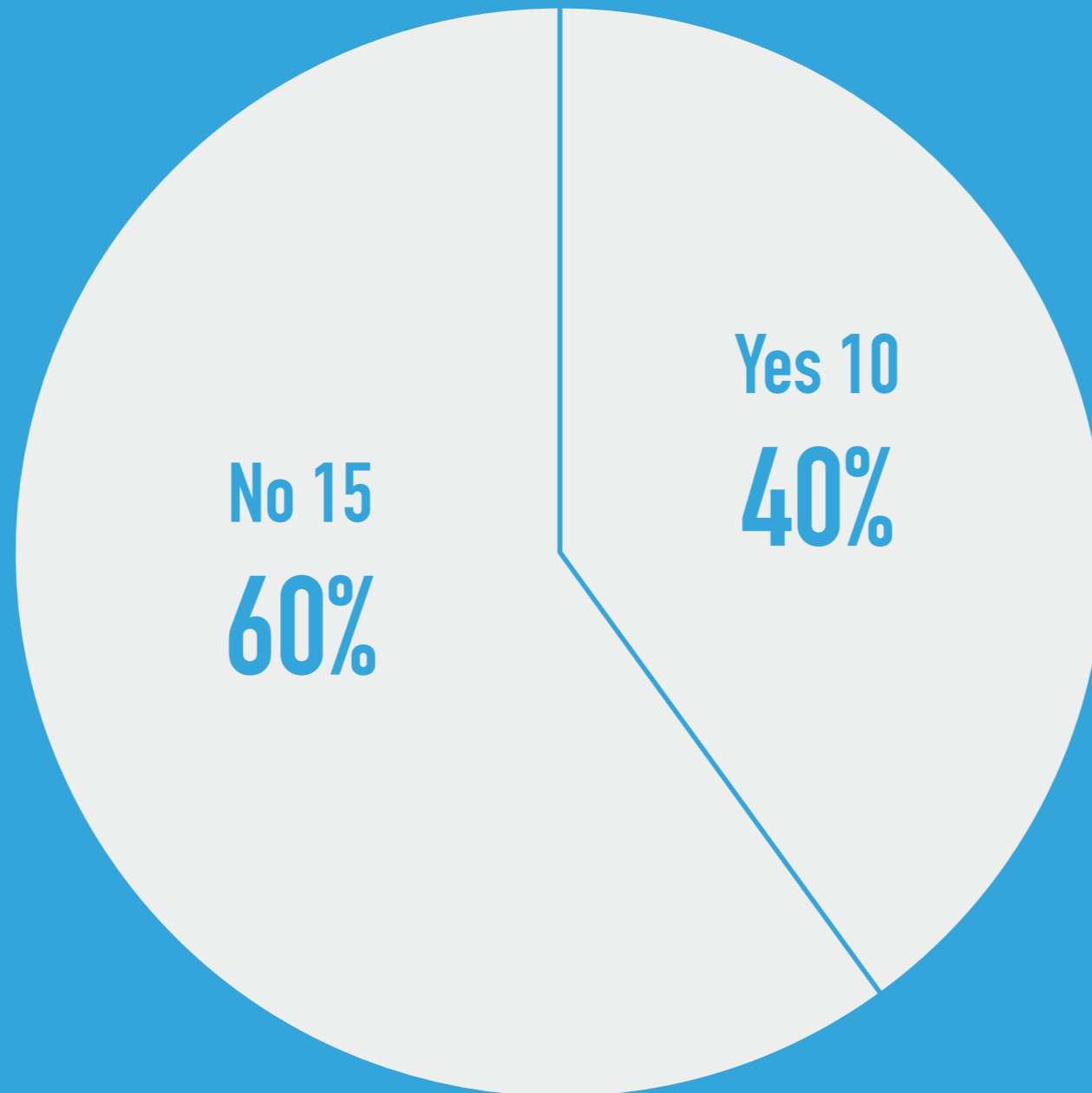

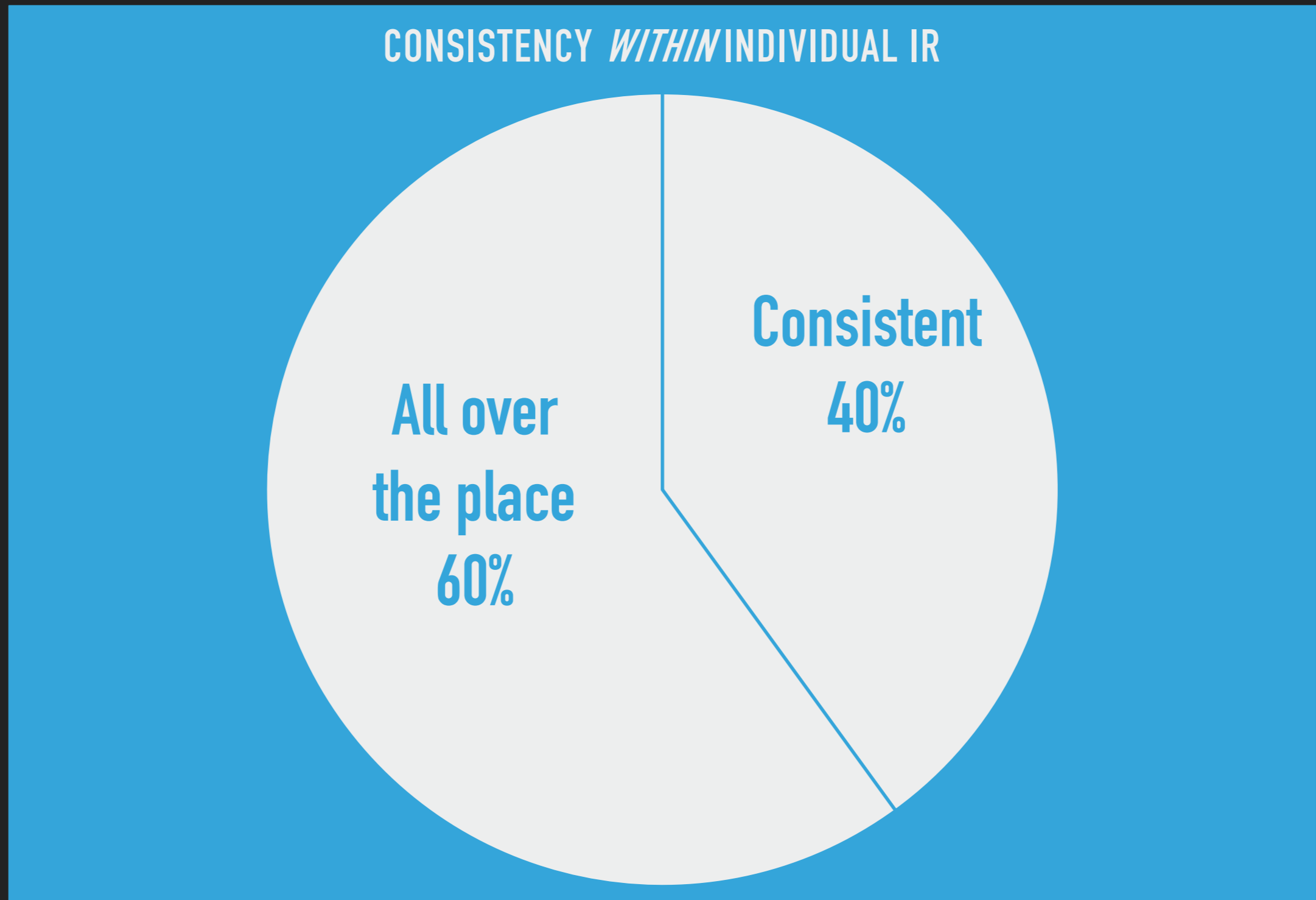

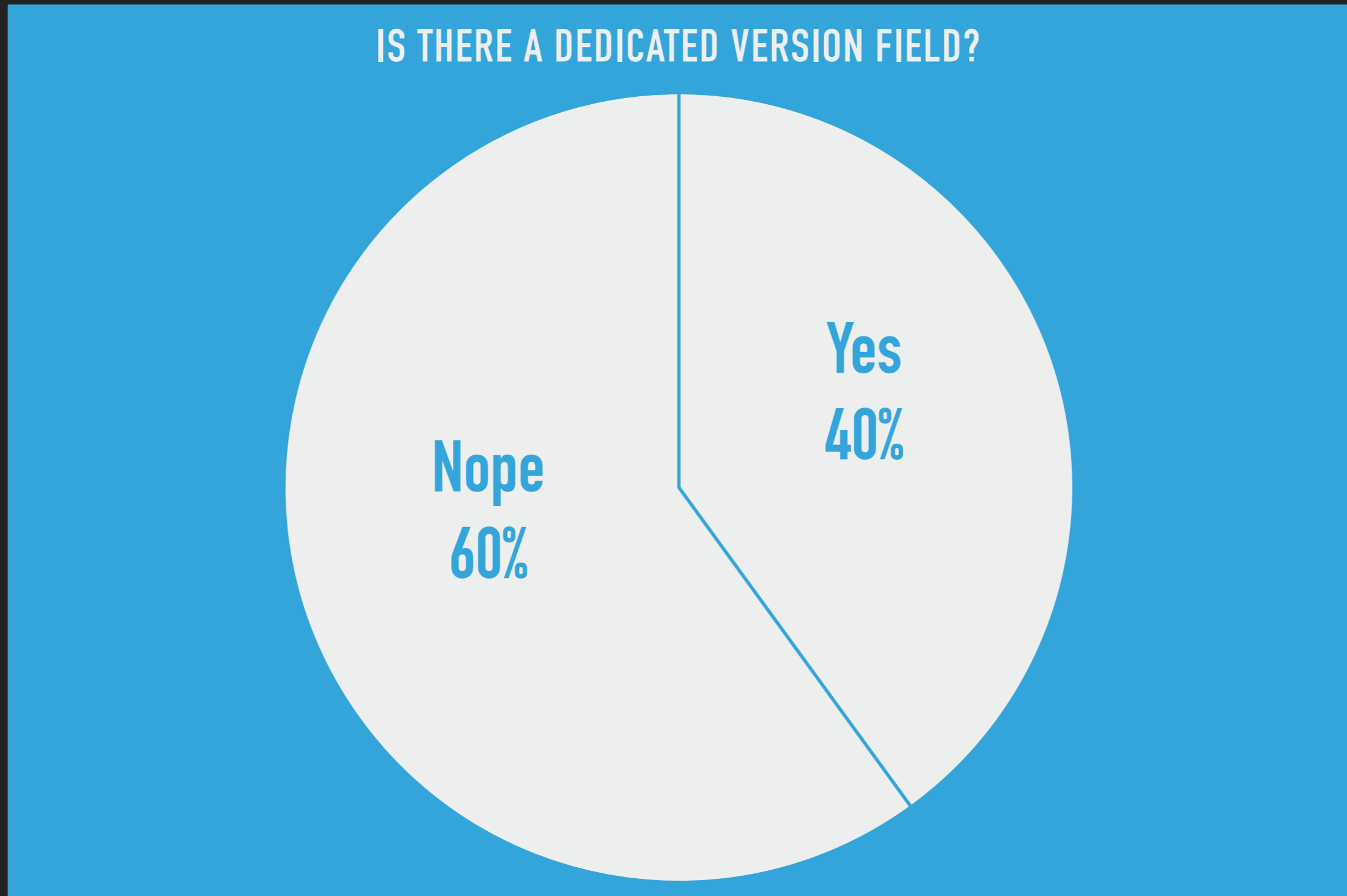

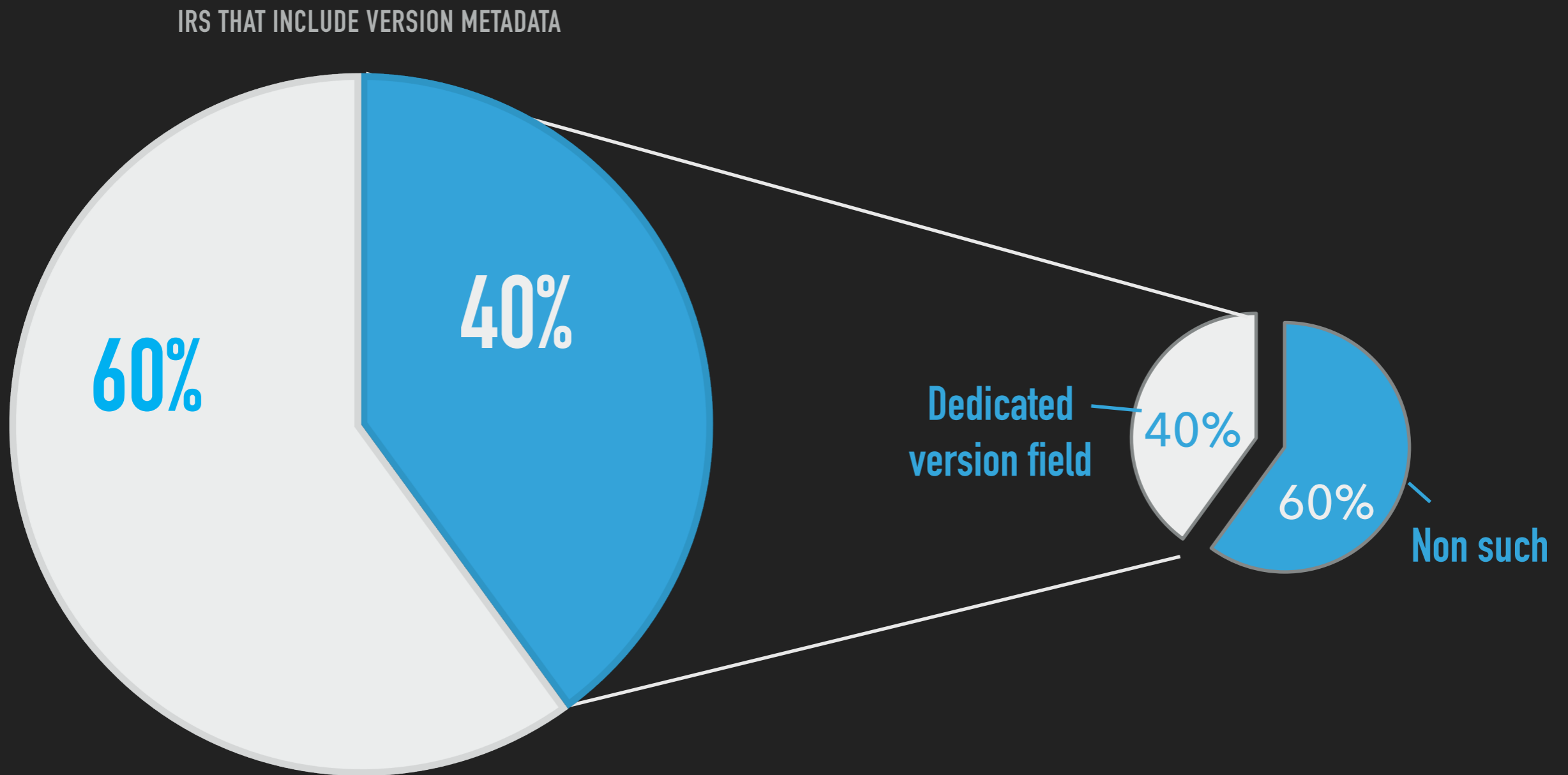

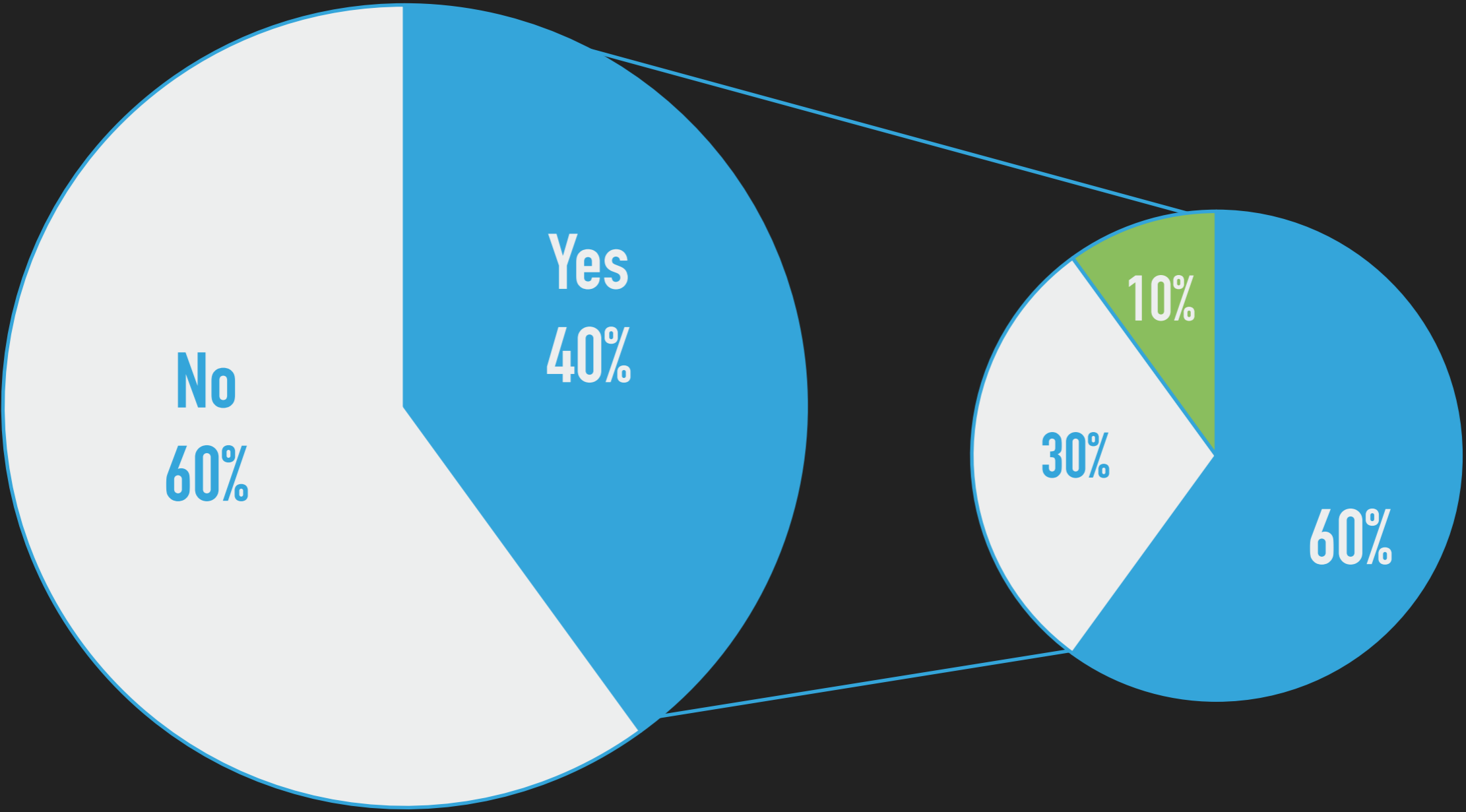
- ▶ Of the 40% that include version metadata

IRS THAT INCLUDE VERSION METADATA



40% have dedicated fields, but only 30% of those with dedicated fields also use consistent language.
