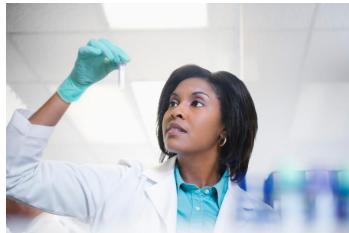

Two New UMCCTS Funding Opportunities!

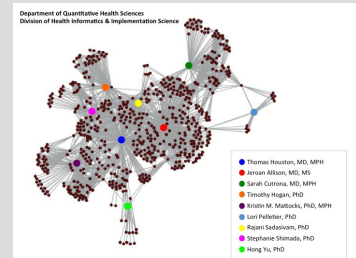

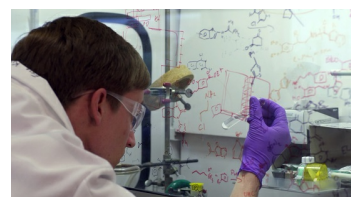
